He has gained exhibition experience in Seoul, Busan, Tokyo, and Jakarta, and sometimes present live painting depending on the location. When He was young, He was fascinated by following dust, smoke, and the wind—wondering where they were heading, how they disappeared, and where they originated from. These curiosities sparked his longing for the invisible world.

He is currently researching ways to make these imperceptible elements visible through painting.
